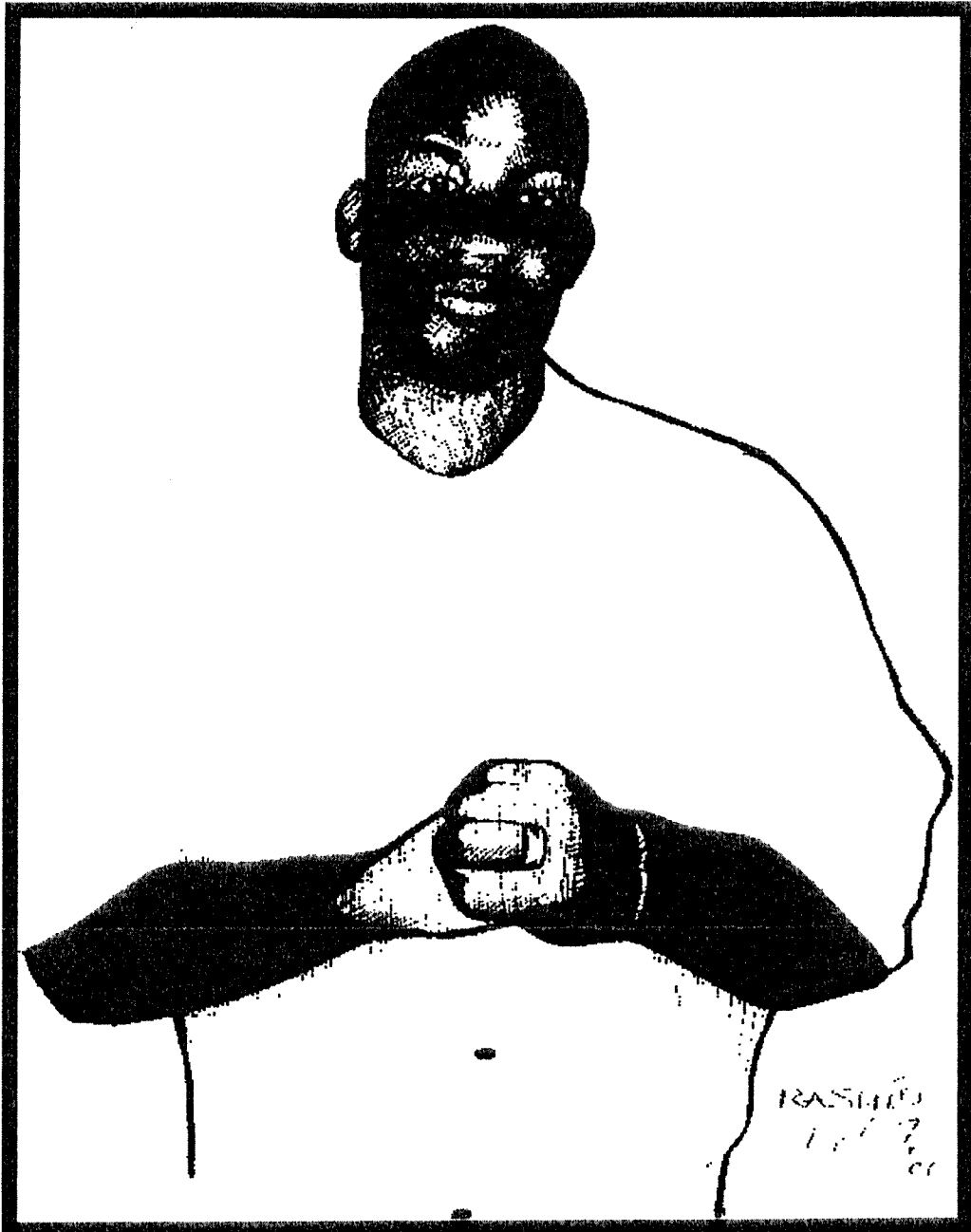

Hasan Shakur (1977-2006)

Another 1,000 Comrades like Him!

Hasan Shakur was born to a poor crack-addicted mother, and after her death, he grew up alone on the mean streets of Amerika and in its youth detention facilities. Framed for a murder he did not commit, he was sentenced to death, but he came alive on Death Row, and he became a Black Panther and the first Minister of Human Rights of the New Afrikan Black Panther Party Prison Chapter.

Comrade Hasan recognized that the fight for human rights is an integral part of the Black Liberation Struggle and the World Proletarian Socialist Revolution. From Death Row he organized the Texas Chapter of the Human Rights Alliance, opposing the death penalty, the use of torture on prisoners and the sentence of life without the possibility of parole.

The state knew he was innocent, that he was framed by the police as so many are. They executed him anyway on August 31, 2006.

Even as he was being marched to his death by lethal injection, his final thoughts and words were of the People and the struggle for social justice he knew would continue after he was gone. He knew that in the end the People will be victorious and he faced death with courage as a revolutionary.
